

# Dickey Lake Bible Camp Covid-19 Health Guidelines

June, 2020

## **1. DLBC is following Local, County and State Guidelines and cognizant of national/CDC recommendations.**

a. **The Lincoln County Health Board has approved these guidelines and expressed the ability to test any camper or staff that becomes symptomatic or asymptomatic staff.**

b. **IMPORTANT:** According to Federal, State and Local guidelines, DLBC is asking the following people to seriously consider staying at home: Those who are immunocompromised, have underlying medical conditions (i.e. asthma), as well as those traveling from high risk areas (and not able to self-quarantine prior to arrival). If your camper fits any of that criteria and still desires to attend camp, please contact the DLBC office.

b. Masks will be available in the event someone becomes symptomatic, as necessary when social distancing is not possible and if campers or staff feel more comfortable wearing one.

## **2. Health Screening Process**

### a. Pre-Screening

-Fever free for 72hrs

-Symptom free for 72hrs

- Anyone having direct contact with someone who has a confirmed case of COVID-19 within the last 14-days will not be allowed to camp.

- Parent/guardian will be asked to confirm/sign off- that their camper is not experiencing any symptoms such as fever, coughing, or shortness of breath and has been fever free/symptom free for 72 hrs.

### b. Arrival at Camp Screening

- Fever/symptom check upon arrival (anyone with a fever of 100.4 or higher will not be allowed to stay at camp).

- Turn in signed waiver verifying pre-screening and sign COVID-19 health risk waiver

- If carpooling, the driver or team leader will be responsible to take each camper's temperature and obtain signed waiver from said camper's parent/guardian verifying pre-screening.

- If an individual camper or a camper that's part of a group fails the "Arrival Screening" the individual or the entire group will not be allowed into camp.

**\*\*\* Please take pre-screening seriously. If your camper fails a symptoms/temp. check, you will be required to come pick up your camper.**

### c. Daily Screenings at Camp

- Screening (fever, symptom) logged by Camp staff daily.

- If a camper or staff member fails daily screening their parent/guardian will be notified. Then, they will be quarantined and observed (if symptoms persist the individual will be taken to nearby medical facility to be tested).

### **3. Cleaning Procedures**

- a. Hand washing/sanitizing stations
- b. Twice daily facility cleaning using approved disinfectant cleaners.

### **4. Daily Screening of Staff**

- a. All staff will be health screened upon arrival to camp.
- b. Temp/Symptom check for on campus and off campus staff.
- c. No sick staff are permitted to work.

### **5. Food Safety**

- a. At DLBC camps we keep the cafeteria well ventilated, use outdoor seating as much as possible, and employ multiple seating's each meal if necessary.
- b. Each camper and staff member are required to wash and/or sanitize hands prior to entering the dining hall. A staff member is designated each mealtime to ensure proper hand hygiene protocols are followed.

### **6. Meetings**

- a. Social distancing guidelines will be followed for meetings based on State and Local guidelines.

### **7. Activities**

- a. Activities will be under staff supervision and designed to minimize contact. DLBC will clean shared recreation equipment daily or after frequent use.

### **8. Sleeping Arrangements**

- a. No more than 10 in a cabin group
- b. Campers will sleep head-to-toe in cabins, with bunks spaced 6 ft. apart.
- c. Toiletries to be kept in a zip-lock bag with personal belongings.

### **9. In the Event of an Outbreak**

- a. DLBC will contact Lincoln County Health Dept. and implement outbreak protocol/safety guidelines advised by State and County.
- b. DLBC outbreak protocol includes isolating symptomatic camper, making sure they receive timely medical attention/testing and notifying parents asap.
